ANTONYMS ÷ Antonyms are words that have contrasting, or opposite meanings. Like so much of the English language, "antonym" is rooted in the Greek language. The Greek word anti means opposite, while anym means name. With the examples of



~~and~~ antonyms listed below, we try to clear that up and offer some tactics for choosing the most appropriate word every time.

## Example of Antonyms ÷

### Nouns

- Noise - silence
- Beginning - end
- Summer - winter
- Friend - enemy

### Adjectives

- Beautiful - ugly
- clever - stupid
- Empty - full
- Dry - wet

### Verbs

- Increase - decrease
- Encourage - discourage
- Close - open
- Create - destroy

SYNONYM ÷ Synonyms are words that have similar meanings. They are often used to help people communicate their feelings in other ways.

synonyms can be used interchangeably.



## Example of Synonyms

### Nouns

- Power and force
- Important and significant
- Car and automobile
- Organization, management, institution.

### Adjectives

- Intelligent, smart, brilliant, bright
- Beautiful, pretty, gorgeous, stunning.
- Sad, unhappy, sorrowful, distressed
- Big, huge, enormous, gigantic

### Verb

- Run, sprint, dash
- Leap, jump, hop, skip
- Talk, speak, communicate, chat
- Smile, beam, grin.

Homonyms:- A homonym is one of group of words that share the same spelling and the same pronunciation but have different meaning. This usually happens as a result of the two words having different origins.

Ex- rose (a type of flower) and rose (past tense of rise) are homonyms.



Homophone :- A homophone is a word that is pronounced the same as another word but differs in meaning. The words may be spelled the same, such as rose (flower) and rose (Past tense "rise").
